Routes 1, 2 & 3 – GARBAGE COLLECTION – Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays - There are no changes in present routes – No person shall place on the curb or mix with household trash or anywhere else at any given time, for purposes of collection any explosive or highly flammable materials or hazardous waste, inclusive of, but not limited to, benzene, gasoline, petroleum, explosive powder, nitrocellulose film or unbroken fluorescent tubes – Route areas can be confirmed by calling the Public Works Department at 927-4048.

TRASHCANS SHALL NOT EXCEED 50 LBS. OR 32 GALLONS.



County – RECYCLING COLLECTION – Every other Friday – This service is provided and regulated by the Atlantic County Utilities Authority. **Call 272-6960 for more information.**

BULK COLLECTION – Every Thursday and Friday – Items include furniture, rugs, non-metal, wood, etc. Any excessive amounts contact the Public Works Department. **No: Automobile or Truck Tires and No Automobile Batteries.**

Zone 1 & 2

METAL COLLECTION – Every other Thursday or Friday depending upon zone – Items include metal and metal goods such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, etc. **REFRIGERATOR AND FREEZER DOORS MUST BE REMOVED FOR SAFETY PURPOSES.**

No: Propane tanks, gas or liquid tanks.

BRUSH COLLECTION – Important rules to follow:



***BRUSH NOW WILL BE COLLECTED ON YOUR TRASH DAY THE FIRST FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH. *YARD WASTE IN RECYCLING, BROWN BAGS ONLY NO PLASTIC BAGS. NO TRASH IN IT.**

1. Brush should be placed at the curbside prior to the beginning of your brush collection schedule, however, it should not be placed at curbside any sooner than 24 hours prior to the beginning of your collection.
2. Brush must be neatly stacked and shall not impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic. Length should be no longer than 4 feet. Smaller branches, twigs and vines that cannot be bundled shall be placed in a plastic or metal trash container, and shall weigh less than 50 lbs.
3. Homeowners will be responsible for removing brush from their premises exceeding the amount that the city will collect.



HOMEOWNERS ARE REQUESTED TO REMOVE BRUSH FROM THE STREET UNTIL IT IS TIME TO PLACE BRUSH AT CURBSIDE ACCORDING TO ZONE SCHEDULE.

City Wide Leaf Collection – Begins during the first week in November.

Only raked leaves will be collected during November and December. Bagged leaves are not permitted at curbside during these months, and will not be collected. Residents should comply with normal schedule and have leaves at curbside during normal published times.

*** No Branch Collection During Leaf Season. *NOTE – Do not mix Branches with Leaves**

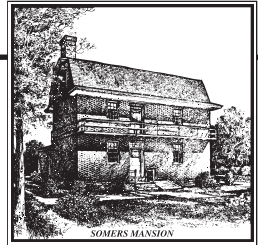

Dear Residents and Business Owners:

In accordance with our NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit, the City has adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment. As part of our Local Public Education Program, the purpose of this letter is to highlight the requirements and environmental benefits of these Ordinances.

1. **Pet Waste:** This Ordinance requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.
2. **Litter:** This Ordinance states that it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. The purpose of the Ordinance is to prevent unsightly and unsanitary conditions and prevent litter from impacting waterways.
3. **Improper Disposal of Waste:** This Ordinance states that is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designated for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose of the Ordinance is to prevent unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.
4. **Wildlife Feeding:** Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The City enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concern regarding bacteria which is harmful to human and fish populations.
5. **Yard Waste:** Yard waste is regulated via Ordinances which establish the current zone collection system and the methods of collecting leaves, brush and other yard waste. The purpose of the Ordinances is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.
6. **Illicit Connections:** This Ordinance makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than stormwater runoff or groundwater (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.
7. **Dumpsters:** This Ordinance requires that dumpsters be covered to prevent refuse from spilling out and entering the storm sewers.
8. **Private Storm Drain Inlet Retrofitting:** This Ordinance requires that existing storm drain inlets in connection with repaving or reconstruction of private property be retrofitted to prevent plastic bottles, cans, food wrappers and other litter from getting into the storm sewers.

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies can result in the destruction of fish, wildlife and habitats. It can also cause threats to public health and the loss of recreational and aesthetic value.

The City has enacted the above Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies.
