An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Somers Point Municipal Code to Add Chapter 164 "Legalized Games of Chance" Repealing Chapter 224 "Sunday Activities" and Repealing all Ordinances Inconsistent Therewith

Whereas, N.J.S.A 5:8-24 the "Bingo Licensing Law" and NJ.S.A. 5:8-50 the "Raffles Licensing Law" provide in NJ.S.A. 5:8-30 and N.J.S.A. 5:8-53 that the governing body if a municipality shall have and shall exercise control and supervision over all games of chance held, operated, or conducted within such municipality; and

Whereas, NJAC 13:47-2.5 provides that no organization shall hold, operate or conduct, or assist in the holding, operating or conducting of any game or games of chance without the approval of the issuing authority; and

Whereas, NJAC 13:47-1.1 defines "issuing authority" as the governing body of a municipality or a person to whom a municipal governing body has delegated by ordinance the authority to approve the granting of raffle and bingo licenses; and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Somers Point believes it is in the best interest of the City of Somers Point and the citizens seeking to obtain a raffle and / or bingo license, that review and approvals of such applications be made in a more expeditious manner by delegating the authority to approve raffle and gaming licensed to the Somers Point City Clerk who has the responsibility to accept such applications and to issue such licenses pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9133 e, (5)

Now, therefore, it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Common Council of the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey that:

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SECTION 1: The Somers Point Municipal Code is hereby amended and supplemented to add Chapter 164 Legalized Games of Chance.

164-1 Statement of Purpose and Statutory Authority.

This chapter is for the purpose of regulating all games of chance held, operated or conducted within the City of Somers Point, pursuant to the "Bingo Licensing Law," N.J.S.A. 5:8-24 et seq., and the "Raffles Licensing Law," N.J.S.A. 5:8-50 et seq., and in accordance with the rules and regulations issued or to be promulgated by the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission in the Department of Law and Public Safety of the State of New Jersey. All applications, licenses and proceedings in connection therewith shall be subject to the provisions of such Acts and the rules and regulations and any laws, rules and regulations hereafter enacted and shall be further subject to the provisions of this chapter.

164-2 Registration with Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission Required.

No organization shall submit an application to conduct a bingo or raffle without first having

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the Somers Point City Clerk within ten (10) days after same has been adopted, and thereafter as required by N.J.S.A. 5:8-22

SECTION 2: Upon the effective date of this Ordinance Somers Point Municipal Code Chapter 224 "Sunday Activities" is hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 4: Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision or any item in any schedule of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE NO. 14 OF 2015, ADOPTED APRIL 30, 2015, OF THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY WHICH PROVIDES FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS AND ACQUISITIONS IN AND BY THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT.

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WHEREAS, on April 30, 2015, the City Council of the City of Somers Point, in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City"), heretofore adopted Bond Ordinance No. 14 of 2015, entitled:

"BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS SEWER UTILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE \$500,000 OF BONDS OR NOTES OF THE CITY FOR FINANCING THE COST THEREOF."

("Bond Ordinance No. 14/1), pursuant to which the City authorized the issuance of bonds or notes in the aggregate principal amount of \$500,000 for the purpose of financing the costs of various capital improvements and acquisitions for the sewer utility system within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to delete one of the purchases by the City as provided in Bond Ordinance No. 14 and reappropriate such funds to another capital improvement to the sewer utility system as hereinafter provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BEIT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERS

POINT, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

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Section 1. Bond Ordinance No. 14 is hereby amended as follows:

(a) Section 3a.) of Bond Ordinance No. 14 is hereby deleted in its entirety.

(b) In Section 3b.) of Bond Ordinance No. 14, the "Appropriation and Estimated Cost" and the "Estimated Maximum Amount of Bonds or Notes" are hereby increased from "\$495,000/1 to "\$500,000/1 for each category.

(c) In Section 6(b) of Bond Ordinance No. 14, the average period of usefulness shall be amended from "39.75/1 years to "40/1 years.

Section 2. This Amendment does not authorize any additional indebtedness, but merely amends Bond Ordinance No. 14 to delete an acquisition and reappropriate such funds to an existing capital improvement specified in Bond Ordinance No. 14.

Section 3. Should any section, subsection or paragraph of this ordinance be declared to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the balance of this ordinance, which shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 4. All other parts of Bond Ordinance No. 14 not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.

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Section 5. This Ordinance amending Bond Ordinance No. 14 shall take effect after the first publication thereof after final adoption as provided by the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING CERTAIN UNEXPENDED PROCEEDS OF THE SALE OF PREVIOUSLY ISSUED BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE THE COST OF ADDITIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND TAKING RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Somers Point, County of Atlantic, New Jersey ("City") has, pursuant to the Local Bond Law, Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), and various bond ordinances duly adopted by the City (the "Ordinances") authorized, issued and sold its general obligation bonds in the year 2012 (the "2012 Obligations") to finance the costs of various municipal projects and improvements as are more fully described in the Ordinances (collectively, the "Prior Projects"); and

WHEREAS, payment of all of the costs of the Prior Projects under the Ordinances has been made or provided for and \$6,538 of the proceeds of the sale of the 2012 Obligations for the Prior Projects are not necessary for such purposes and remain unexpended ("Unexpended Proceeds"); and

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WHEREAS, Section 40A:2-39 of the Local Bond Law provides that, if, in the opinion of the City Council of the City ("Council"), it is in the best interest of the City, the Unexpended Proceeds may be appropriated to and used to finance the cost of any other purpose or purposes for which bonds may be issued; and
WHEREAS, Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to appropriate the Unexpended Proceeds towards the costs of additional capital improvements and projects for the City as hereinafter specified.

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NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERS POINT, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Capital Character of Additional Projects; Authorization. It is hereby determined that the Unexpended Proceeds shall be used to finance replacements, improvements and renovations to various municipal pump stations, mains, and other system components together with all materials and work necessary and incidental thereto and related thereto in the amount of **\$6,538** (collectively, the "**Additional Projects**"). The Additional Projects constitute purposes for which bonds may be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law, having a period of usefulness in excess of five (5) years, as required by Section 40A:2-21 of the Local Bond Law. The implementation of the Additional Projects is hereby authorized to be made as general improvements in and for the City.

Section 2. Appropriation of Unexpended Proceeds. It is hereby determined that, in the opinion of Council, it is in the best interest of the City to appropriate the Unexpended Proceeds in the amount of **\$6,538** to finance the costs associated with the Additional Projects, and accordingly, said sum is hereby appropriated.

Section 3. Capital Budget Amendment. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital improvement program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the City Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 4. No Additional Indebtedness Authorized. This Ordinance does not authorize any additional indebtedness, but merely appropriates proceeds of the Obligations in excess of the amount required to complete the improvements for the financing of which such 2012 Obligations were originally issued.

Section 5. Repeal of Inconsistent Legislation. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof to the extent inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or rescinded.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final adoption and publication as required by law.

Planning Board Recommendation No.2

Ron Meischker indicated that the City Code allows for gasoline service stations in certain zones, but not allowing service stations that did have gasoline. The recommendation is an attempt to clean up the wording. Mayor, City Council and City Administrator thoroughly discussed the recommendation. City Council President McGuigan requested James Franklin, Esq., to prepare an ordinance supporting the Planning Board's recommendation for consideration at the next regular City Council meeting.

City Council thoroughly discussed the proposed ordinance due to the aggressive Bamboo plant. City Councilman D'Adamo supported the proposed ordinance. Council President McGuigan will prepare an ordinance for consideration at the next regular City Council meeting.

Pet Purchase Protection Act

Councilman Toto explained that the proposed ordinance is to prevent puppy mills and kitten factories that are overbreeding with inhumane treatment and illnesses. Hopefully this ordinance will prevent that and relieve the burden on local shelters. Councilman Smith expressed his concern that the ordinance should be less restrictive for the general public that wants to sell their litter to their neighbor. The bills were approved by a unanimous vote of those present. A complete list of bills is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.
